ABOUT DREAM CITY

WHAT IS DREAM CITY?

Dream City is an audience-driven community established in 2012 at Roskilde Festival. It's located on campsite H, one of the festival's most central camping areas. The foundation of the community is based on sustainable and socially responsible dreams and core values like citizenship, innovation, co-creation and diversity.

SOCIAL SUSTAINABILITY

In Dream City, social sustainability is at the heart of our community. That's why we are committed to promoting diversity, accessibility, and safety for everyone in Dream City. Embracing diversity and respecting personal boundaries are essential for building a community where everyone feels included. We collaborate closely with the rest of the festival to prevent discrimination, harassment, bullying, and other forms of behavior that violates personal boundaries. We have a zero-tolerance policy for such behavior, as we believe that everyone has the right to feel safe and respected in our community.

DREAM CITY AGAINST DRUGS

In Dream City, we take a strong stance against drug use, just like the rest of Roskilde Festival. Our community is built on the values of safety and responsibility, and the use of illegal substances goes against these principles. We have a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to illegal substances, and we will not hesitate to report any such activities to the festival security or the police. We encourage our camps as well as our volunteers to help us with upholding these standards to ensure a safe and enjoyable festival experience for everyone.

FACILITIES IN DREAM CITY

CITY HALL

This is the center of Dream City where you can get help, guidance or just meet up with friends. This is also the place to find most of our volunteers when they're working, both before and during the festival.

Before the festival begins, it's possible to borrow tools for a deposit of 500,- DKK.

COMMUNITY KITCHEN

Bring your own groceries to the Community Kitchen and prepare your own food. You can find all the utilities you need to cook a nice meal in the kitchen. Dream City Community Kitchen is only open during the festival.

REGISTRATION

Register your camp on Roskilde Festivals website. To register, you'll need a description of your camp, your concept and your contribution to the community. If you wish to register as a construction camp, make sure you have a clear vision for your construction when registering. Registration opens on January 29th and closes on March 18th.

CONTACT PERSON

When registering for Dream City, you are required to appoint a contact person who will serve as the main information link between your camp and Dream City. This role involves receiving important emails, reminders, and updates that your camp needs to be aware of promptly and distributing this knowledge to the camp. Ensure the chosen contact person is available for the entire period and not off travelling somewhere.

WORKSHOP

Each camp must be represented at at least one of the three workshops held on March 3rd, 11th, and 19th. Time, location, and further information can be found in the confirmation mail you receive after registering or on our Facebook page; Dream City - Roskilde Festival.

GETTING A SPOT IN DREAM CITY

Dream City consists of camping areas and project areas. Every camp will be assigned a camping area and construction camps will be assigned a construction area next to their camping area. Event camps will have the opportunity to use the common event spaces. Due to safety reasons it is not allowed to sleep or camp in your construction area. The placement of camps will be announced via email and will be finalised after completing all three steps outlined above.

FIRST DAY ON GRASS

When your camp has completed steps 1 and 2, it can be allocated a spot in Dream City. To secure your place in Dream City, you must participate in the official opening (First Day on Grass) on April 18th, where you will also be given your sleeping areas, construction areas, and can meet and coordinate with your neighbours.

TIP:

Before you plan your project, make sure to set expectations on participation, budget, deadlines, responsibilities and rules with your camp!

INSPIRATION FOR YOUR PROJECT

To inspire and challenge your concepts and ideas, we encourage you to go through the questions below, to ensure that you're dreaming up!

What are the core values of your camp and how does this show in your concept?



How can you ensure that this will be a fun experience for everyone involved?

How will you physically represent your ideas? (constructions, events, costumes, decorations etc.)



Which part of your concept could you change to be more inclusive?

How can your camp become more sustainable, both environmentally and socially?



How does your camp contribute to the entire festival, and not just to yourself or your neighbours?



Does your concept have a context that reaches beyond the festival or the community?



SUSTAINABILITY AND RECYCLING

In Dream City, we embrace the 'Leave No Trace' mindset, requiring camps to not only keep their areas tidy but also to actively participate in our community clean-up day on July 5th. During opening hours, you can get garbage bags from our volunteers at City Hall, both before and during the festival.

Recycling stations are located next to City Hall. These stations cover everything from domestic waste to metal, wood, and chemicals, but also recycled materials from previous years. These recycled materials will be up for grabs starting the first construction weekend, and are first come, first serve. Remember, take only what you need and spread the love by sharing with fellow Dreamers!

We encourage all our camps to consider the sources of their materials carefully. If it's at all possible to utilise upcycled materials, this lowers the overall environmental impact and most of the time it's cheaper too. Be creative in your solutions, use your network and dream green while dreaming up!



TIP:

You can make the clean-up day (July 5th) a lot easier, by assigning specific people to be in charge of the cleanup and making sure to coordinate with your neighbouring camps beforehand!





TIP:

When planning your project, remember to consider the amount of time and people you have available in your camp. Large projects require a lot of both time and people to finish in time!

IMPORTANT DATES

JANUARY 29TH – REGISTRATION

Registration for Dream City 2026 opens on Roskilde Festival's website.

FEBRUARY 21ST – KICK-OFF

Join Dream City to kick off 2026 the right way. This day is voluntary, but will contain presentations with news, important dates and other 'nice to have'-information.

MARCH 3RD, 11TH AND 19TH – WORKSHOPS

One or more members from your camp must attend one of the workshops. All the workshops are from 18.00 to 21.00. Workshops 1 and 3 are held in Copenhagen and Workshop 2 in Roskilde.

MARCH 18TH – REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Deadline for registration for Dream City 2026 on Roskilde Festival's website.

APRIL 14TH – CONFIRMATION

After registration is closed, our volunteers will allocate camping and construction areas. You will get a confirmation of your registration and allocated area on April 14th.

APRIL 18TH – FIRST DAY ON GRASS

Your invitation to the grand opening of Dream City 2026.

CONSTRUCITON WEEKS

April 18-19th / April 25-26th / May 2-3rd / May 9-10th / May 16-17th / May 23-24st / May 30-31st / June 6-7th / June 13-14th / June 20-21st

JUNE 20TH – HOUSE WARMING

The annual housewarming and your invitation to set up your tents.

JUNE 27TH – ROSKILDE FESTIVAL

Roskilde Festival has officially begun! All Dreamers enter the campsite together with everyone else when the gates open.

JULY 5TH – CLEAN UP DAY

Clean Up Day is mandatory for everyone in Dream City. Together we will clean up the entire campsite H.

FALL 2026 – DREAM CITY EVALUATION

Dream City Evaluation is where you, Dreamers, have the opportunity to share your thoughts and opinions about everything in Dream City.

Note: It's mandatory for overwintering construction camps to participate.

CONSTRUCTION CAMPS IN DREAM CITY

Construction camps are required to make detailed drawings of their constructions which will be approved by the volunteers on the Dream City Support team and later by the municipality of Roskilde.

DEADLINE CONSTRUCTION DRAWINGS: APRIL 23RD

All camps are responsible for their own materials, tools and food during the construction weekends. A limited amount of recycled materials from previous years will be made available from the beginning of the building weekends. A limited amount of tools are available to borrow at City Hall, but we do not guarantee that every tool will be available at all times.

TO BORROW TOOLS YOU NEED TO LEAVE A DEPOSIT OF 500,- KR. CASH. You can buy smaller tool accessories like jigsaw blades and bits at cost price (in limited amounts).

It is not possible to buy food in Dream City during the construction weekends, so remember to pack some snacks or plan for a food run.

The volunteers in Dream City will not help build the construction, but will happily guide you in the best way to build.

TIP:

Sometimes projects take a little longer than expected. Make sure you have a plan B if your construction or event turns out to be a bit too ambitious...

NOTE:

Large stones from the hole digging must NOT be placed on the grass but removed from the area, as they damage the lawn mower

SAFETY APPROVAL

Roskilde Festival and Dream City cares a lot about your safety. The campsite will be closed from the 22nd of June until the festival begins due to an overall safety approval of the campsite. Roskilde municipality and fire department are responsible for the final approval of all building projects. The Dream City Support Team will continually assess the safety of the constructions, and can answer your questions about building safety.

DRILLING HOLES FOR YOUR CONSTRUCTION

When you build a construction, you often need deep holes to stabilise and secure the skeleton of the construction. A drilling machine will pass by Dream City on the first weekend and dig the holes for your construction. To plan this day, we need to know how many holes are needed for your construction before the First Day on Grass. Once the holes are drilled YOU MUST MARK THE HOLES THE SAME DAY by placing a post in the hole. This is for both safety reasons and to ensure that the holes don't collapse.

RESTRICTIONS

We want you to explore your creativity and dream up the best city of all, therefore we don't have many restrictions on constructions as long as it's safe, realistic and incorporates the values of Dream City.

However, due to rules set by the festival, it is not allowed to build stages meant for concerts, since this violates the contracts with the artists playing at the festival.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

SPONSORSHIP // ADVERTISING?

It is allowed to receive sponsorships, but in no way is it allowed to advertise for these through banners, stickers, flyers, merchandise etc. In doing so you mess with the policies in Dream City and at Roskilde Festival.

It is not allowed to advertise any artists playing or appearing in your camp, as this violates festival rules and poses security risks.

WHEN CAN I SET UP MY TENT?

Tents can be set up on the last weekend before the festival. Remember to coordinate with your neighbours on the First Day on Grass. Any tents set up before this weekend will be removed. It is not allowed to use tarpaulins to reserve an area. If you don't set your tent up this weekend, your camping area will be free for everyone when the festival opens on the 27th of June.

WHEN AND HOW DO I ENTER THE CAMPSITE ON THE 27TH OF JUNE?

When you are a part of Dream City you either buy a festival ticket or become a volunteer. You enter the festival along with everyone else.

CAN I DRIVE MY CAR IN DREAM CITY BEFORE THE FESTIVAL?

Driving is permitted in the case of loading and unloading of goods. You can park your car at the parking lots. In case you have ordered materials to the campsite, please make sure that the vehicle drives on dry soil.

IS IT ALLOWED TO PLAY MUSIC DURING THE CONSTRUCTION WEEKENDS?

It is permitted to play music during the weekends, but loud music is forbidden. People live around the area and should not be disturbed unnecessarily.

WHAT IS CLEAN UP DAY THE 5TH OF JULY?

On Clean Up Day (5th of July) all Dreamers come together to clean up all of Dream City before going home. It is your responsibility to preserve the environment in Dream City and clean up garbage, cigarette buds, camp materials and broken glass from your camping site and the assigned walking area. It is recommended that every camp communicates with their neighbours on how to clean up the area together.

Dreamers will be assisted by Dream City volunteers on how to recycle their camp materials and big containers will be available for your trash. Before leaving the area every camp has to pass by the City Hall to get their campsite approved.

Clean Up Day is mandatory for everyone in Dream City and during the day a cheap meal will be served at City Hall. You need to buy food tickets before the festival begins.

VOLOUNTEERS IN DREAM CITY

SUPPORT TEAM

We are responsible for evaluating all new constructions and approving their safety. We are also in charge of the Safety Seminar at the workshops, where we go through basic construction safety and tips and tricks for getting your construction approved. If you have any questions concerning construction safety, feel free contact bygdc@roskilde-festival.dk.

FACILITATION TEAM

We are responsible for guiding and assisting everyone in Dream City. When you pass by The City Hall we will help you in the best way possible. You can meet us multiple places in Dream City wearing a yellow vest with the Dream City logo on. Our primary location is at City Hall from 09.00-21.00 Saturday and 10.00 - 18.00 Sunday every construction weekend and every day during the festival from 10.00-18.00.

SITE TEAM

We are responsible for maintaining and building constructions in Dream City, such as the City Hall, the storage and recycling station and other facilities. You can find us in Dream City on the weekends or come ask for us at the City Hall.

REGISTRATION TEAM

We are responsible for receiving registrations, checking that the application lives up to our guidelines, identity and values. We allocate camping areas and construction areas when registration closes and finally we are the ones who approves each area at Clean Up Day.

COMMUNICATION TEAM

We are responsible for communicating with the Dreamers, as well as the media and other branches of Roskilde Festival. We help organize events, workshops and parties as well as managing Dream City's social media accounts. PRODUCTION TEAM

We are responsible for organizing and coordinating the festival facilities and materials in Dream City, such as containers, plumbing, electricity, IT etc. You might meet us on the fields during the weekends.
